Bargh, Brian J, *The Volcanic Plateau*, Wellington, Waitangi Tribunal Rangahaua Whanui Series, working paper: first release, December 1995. This report is one of the Rangahaua Whanui Series, a series of reports that are being written for the Tribunal to give a broad overview of land and other resource losses by Maori throughout New Zealand since the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi. These losses are set in context and an outline of the claims is also given.

Bargh, Brian J, and R J Young, 'Okahukura and Taurewa Blocks – Ngati Hikairo/Rakeipoho', report commissioned by the Ngati Hikairo/Rakeipoho claimants, June 1992. The report was prepared for the Ngati Hikairo/Rakeipoho claimants as evidence to the Crown Forestry Rental Trust of their rights to the Taurewa and Okahukura blocks. The report outlines the way in which these lands were purchased by the Crown.

Beca Carter Hollings and Ferner/Berl, 'Report on Gravel Extraction, 1903–1988', report commissioned by the Waitangi Tribunal, 1988 (Wai 167 ROD, doc A31). This report is based on the recommendations of Sir Harold Johnston's royal commission on the Whanganui River. Johnston recommended that the Crown pay Whanganui hapu royalties for the large amount of gravel that had been taken from the river over many years by the Crown and local bodies. From the available records, the commission calculated the amount of gravel taken and applied a royalty to it. Depending on how inflation is taken into account, the commission's report claimed that Whanganui Maori should have been paid between and \$8 million and \$21 million in present day value for the gravel.

Ward, Alan, 'Whanganui ki Maniapoto: Preliminary Historical Report – Wai 48 and Related Claims', report commissioned by the Waitangi Tribunal, March 1992. This report was compiled in order to examine a number of similar claims in the central North Island relating to the Crown's acquisition of land for the main trunk railway. It discusses Maori resistance to land purchasing in the Whanganui and Rohe Potae areas, the attempt to make a carefully controlled opening in the 1880s, and the Crown's undermining of these efforts in order to secure the freehold of most of the district.

Young, R J, 'Wanganui River Claim and Related Issues', Manatu Maori, 1990 (Wai 167 ROD, doc A47). A chronological account of the Crown's actions relating to the Whanganui River. The Crown is portrayed as being intransigent over the issue of the ownership of the Whanganui River. Despite Maori protestations, successive governments have claimed that the riverbed belongs to the Crown and have forced developments on the river, often without the sanction of Whanganui Maori, who have maintained consistently that, under the Treaty of Waitangi, they own the river.
